ARTURO FALASCHI

Arturo Falaschi, Professor of Molecular Biology at the Scuola Normale Superiore di Pisa, died suddenly at age 77 following a heart attack. After graduating in Medicine Arturo Falaschi decided to devote himself to Molecular Biology in the laboratory of Nobel laureate Arthur Kornberg in Stanford, California. For many years he was then director of the Laboratory of Evolutionary Genetics of CNR in Pavia, and then to Trieste for 10 years director of the Center for Genetics and Biotechnology, relating to UNESCO. Arturo Falaschi was one of the best Italian scientists in the life sciences. EMBO member, was one of the most respected scholars of molecular biology at internazionale. Da many years had concentrated his research and his group on one of the central problems in all cell biology: the origins of DNA replication. In this line of research has continued to make important contributions, the latter of whom now in press. Given the importance of DNA replication in cancer, Arturo had become an enthusiastic supporter of the Institute of Tuscany Toscano Tumori.
