## New Tuberculosis break-through

Researchers at the International Centre for Genetic Engineering and Biotechnology (ICGEB), New Delhi, have isolated the 44 human proteins that the TB bacterium uses to survive inside the human body. This break-through will help in developing an alternative treatment drug which can suppress the production of these proteins, and can be used in combination with the existing anti-biotic drugs to "hit TB from 2 sides at once".

The new drugs developed will also help in treatment of anti-biotic drug resistant cases.

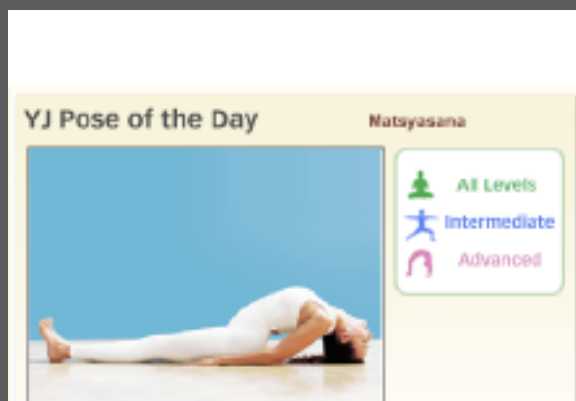

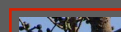
